## Summary

Mansa Musa was the ruler of Mali during the 14th century. He was one of the richest rulers in the world. Mali mined for gold and salt and made large profits. In 1324 Mansa Musa went on a pilgrimage (hajj) to Mecca where his journey through Egypt caused a stir. He travelled with a caravan of tens of thousands of warriors and slaves. Mansa Musa met the Sultan of Egypt and gave away so much gold that the value of the currency decreased. Stories of his wealth reached Europe and he is shown on the Catalan Atlas, made by the Spanish, sitting on a throne holding a nugget of gold. Mali took over Gao and Timbuktu and new mosques were built.
